In today's world, health insurance is very complex and can add to the decisions you will have to make when selecting infertility treatment options. Insurance coverage for fertility services varies from state to state and from plan to plan, so it's important to understand exactly what your insurance plan may or may not cover for your fertility treatments. Some insurance plans cover no infertility services, others may pay for all of it, and others are somewhere in between.

Our billing office is here to help! A representative will call you to explain your insurance coverage and benefits. During the meeting, we will review the cost of the medical treatments that you may be considering and advise you of any responsibility for payment that you may have due to deductibles, co-insurance, or co-payments.

It is important for you as a patient to be the best advocate for yourself by completely understanding your insurance policy. It is critical that you review your specific insurance policy and understand what will be paid by insurance and what will not be covered. We recommend reaching out to your insurance company directly and inquiring about your benefits for fertility coverage. Ensure that you establish a point of contact with a representative at your insurance company and document their name and contact information, as it may improve any follow-up that may be required. Make sure to request written documentation for all phone conversations concerning coverage and insurance benefits. Check with HR for Carrot, Progyny, Maven, or custom plans. These benefits may cover large portions of treatment.

Use pre-tax dollars for out-of-pocket fertility-related medical expenses, including medication and procedures.

FERTILITY GRANTS

Organizations like Baby Quest, Nest Egg Foundation, Cade Foundation, and others offer grants for those undergoing treatment.

STATE MANDATES


Some states require insurers to cover or offer fertility benefits. Research your local laws.

CLINICAL TRIALS

Participating in trials may give access to low-or no-cost care while contributing to research.

REFUND OR MULTI-CYCLE PROGRAMS

Refund-backed programs or discounts for purchasing multiple cycles in advance.

Financing fertility is more than just paperwork—it's deeply emotional. Balancing finances while navigating treatment can lead to anxiety, comparison, or overwhelm. You are not alone.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What if I don't qualify for a loan?

Many partners offer financing options for a wide range of credit profiles. You may also consider employer-sponsored benefits, HSA/FSA funds, or applying with a co-borrower. Our financial counselor can help you explore all of your options.

Can I use more than one financing option?

Yes. Some patients combine employer benefits (like Maven or Progyny) with personal financing from CapexMD or others to manage different parts of their treatment costs.

What are typical interest rates?

Loan rates vary depending on credit score, amount borrowed, and repayment term. Rates with some partners can range from 6.99%-35.99% APR.

Will applying affect my credit score?

Most partners offer pre-qualification with a soft credit check, which does not impact your score. A hard check occurs only upon final loan approval.

How do I coordinate with insurance?

Bring your insurance information to your initial consultation. Our financial counselor will help identify covered services and integrate your benefits with any partner program you use.

SMART QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR INSURANCE COMPANY

Do I have fertility coverage, and if so, what is included?
Are there criteria I must meet to qualify for fertility benefits?
Are there any exclusions to my fertility coverage?
Is a prior authorization required for treatment or medications?
Are fertility medications covered under my medical plan or a separate pharmacy benefit?
What diagnostic testing is included (bloodwork, ultrasounds, etc.)?
What is my deductible, and how much have I met this year?
What are my co-payment and co-insurance responsibilities?

Use this checklist as a starting point for conversations with your insurance provider, HR department, or benefits manager. Being informed is one of the most empowering steps you can take. Write your answers down and confirm what you understand with your contact person.



WHAT YOU DON'T KNOW TO ASK

Important questions to ask your clinic, lender, and yourself:

Are there discounts for multiple cycles?

Yes—some clinics offer bundled pricing or work with partners to reduce costs with multi-cycle plans.

Are there any prepayment penalties?

Most financing partners do not penalize early repayment. Always confirm with the lender.

What if I delay treatment?

Loan offers and interest rates may change over time. Employer benefits can also shift annually, so check with HR and your clinic about timelines.

What defines "success" for me emotionally and financially?

Success is deeply personal. For some, it means one healthy embryo; for others, peace of mind and emotional clarity. Consider your values and goals alongside outcomes.

You don't need to know everything. You just need to know it's okay to ask.

GLOSSARY OF COMMON FERTILITY & INSURANCE TERMS

BENEFIT YEAR

The 12-month period your insurance uses to calculate benefits. It may not align with the calendar year.

CO-INSURANCE

A percentage of the cost of care you pay after meeting your deductible. For example, if your plan covers 80%, you're responsible for the remaining 20%.

CO-PAYMENT (CO-PAY)

A fixed amount you pay for a covered service, such as a visit to your fertility specialist or a lab test. This is usually due at the time of service.

COVERAGE LIMIT

The maximum dollar amount or number of cycles your insurance will pay for fertility treatment.

CYCLE MONITORING

Tracking hormone levels and follicle growth via bloodwork and ultrasounds during treatment. May not be fully covered.

DEDUCTIBLE

The amount you must pay out of pocket each year before your insurance starts covering services.

EXPLANATION OF BENEFITS (EOB)

A document from your insurance that explains what was billed, what they paid, and what you may owe. Not a bill, but helpful to track.

FERTILITY MEDICATIONS

Medications used to stimulate ovulation or support treatment (e.g., Clomid, Letrozole, gonadotropins). Coverage varies.

FORMULARY

A list of prescription medications your insurance covers. Fertility drugs may fall under a separate pharmacy plan.

HIGH-DEDUCTIBLE HEALTH PLAN (HDHP)

An insurance plan with lower monthly premiums and higher out-of-pocket costs.

INSURANCE VERIFICATION

The process of confirming what your insurance will cover—ideally before treatment begins.

LIFETIME MAXIMUM

The total amount your insurance will pay for fertility treatment over your lifetime.

MEDICAL VS. PHARMACY BENEFIT

Some medications are billed through your medical plan, others through your pharmacy plan. This impacts coverage and cost.

OUT-OF-NETWORK PROVIDER

A clinic or specialist not contracted with your insurance. Costs may be higher or not covered at all.

OUT-OF-POCKET COSTS

Any expense you pay yourself—includes your deductible, co-pays, co-insurance, and anything not covered by insurance.

OUT-OF-POCKET MAXIMUM

The most you'll pay in a year for covered services. Once reached, insurance usually pays 100% of the remaining costs.

PRECERTIFICATION

Another term for prior authorization—insurance approval needed before certain services are covered.

PRIOR AUTHORIZATION

Approval from your insurance required before certain treatments or medications. Without it, you may be responsible for full cost.

SELF-PAY DISCOUNT

A reduced rate for patients who pay out of pocket without insurance. Available at some clinics.

SHARED RISK PROGRAM

A bundled payment option covering multiple treatment cycles. May include a refund if treatment isn't successful.

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
